

Materials and methods: consumers' profile


- Flanders (Belgium): 5 provinces (± 6 million people)
- Oral inquiry, autumn 2009
- Social events, markets, railway stations,...
- 1018 people (16-80 years old; societal sample)


Questionnaire


- Opinion on:
 - 1. The issue of piglet castration
 - 2. Anaesthetized castration with analgesia
 - 3. Raising entire males
 - 4. Immunovaccination
 - 5. Acceptability of the proposed alternatives


Results

1. Opinion on the issue of piglet castration









2. Anaesthetized castration with analgesia

 98.5%: acceptable when pain during and after castration can be treated

 63.3%: farmers should be able to administer the anaesthesia themselves

40.4%: willing to pay extra



Only 2.26% finds this acceptable

More agression during rearing: influenced 66.7% of respondents


4. Immunovaccination


48.8%: acceptable


67.6% association with hormones

 72.2 % is concerned about the non speciesspecificity of the vaccine, for safety reasons


5. Acceptability of the proposed alternatives








Preference (%) on alternatives for unanaesthetized piglet castration

Conclusions

Half of the respondents are not aware of the problem

The majority wants unanaesthetized castration to be banned

 The willingness to pay extra for alternatives is low (method specific)
