


Fig. 8.15 Reduction in levels of infection in 3 years in 30 UK herds after introduction of the NIRD/CVL 'Five Point Plan' mastitis control rcutine (MFE3).










Mastitis: acute phase response











Figure 9. Meat production in developing countries.





Can animals feel pain?



Whether animals can feel pain has been a controversial issue for many years. Animals and humans share similar **mechanisms of pain detection**, have similar areas of the brain involved in processing pain and show similar **pain behaviours**, but it is notoriously difficult to assess how animals actually experience pain.



Impact of rbST on incidence of mastitis and lameness






















Figure 1. C. odorata intake during 15 min (mean \pm SD) in 3-mo old goat kids born to control goats or to goats fed C. odorata for the last 3 mo of pregnancy. * shown the significant differences between groups within a week.












Draft design for the 8,000 cow rotary Cow Comfort Centre
