A Board meeting of Journal Animal was held in Edinburgh on 19 May 2011. Among other items the 2010 journal budget was approved. EAAP members of the Management Board made sure that funds from the Journal budget were available to support young scientists also for the 2012 annual meeting.

We wish to thank **Cledwyn Thomas** (UK) for his excellent job as Chair of the Animal Management Board since

the establishment of the Journal. After his resignation, EAAP proposed **Nigel Scollan** (UK) to take over the Chairmanship of the Journal. We wish him great success!

ANIMAL – The International Journal of Animal Biosciences

The Journal had increased its impact factor by nearly 50% to 1.46 after only two years. The next impact factor will be published in July this year and we hope to see further progress. Information on highly cited papers can be found on <http://journals.cambridge.org/anm>.

Over the next year the Journal will, in addition to submitted papers, publish main papers from a meeting in Guadeloupe on 'Farming in a Changing World' and also the International Symposium on Herbivore Nutrition (www.isnh8.org). The Journal will publish papers from 2010 EAAP annual meeting about the Workshop on the Biology of Lactation, New Phenotypes for new breeding goals, Robust cattle production systems, Intestinal health in monogastrics, Evolution of the Mammary Gland and Foetal Programming

Advances in Animal Biosciences

In addition to Animal, the consortium has launched a new journal – Advances in Animal Biosciences. The aim is to publish the proceedings of conferences. In the first three issues are the proceedings of the Annual Meeting of BSAS, abstracts from the 'Farming in a Changing
